

# CODE OF SACRED HONOR

## Preface

During Forums in Memphis, TN – Jackson, MS – New Orleans, LA – Houston, TX – Austin, TX – and Dallas, TX, participants entered into a discussion on the feasibility of holding our elected and appointed officials accountable and responsibility to us, the people. The central question was how would it work and could it work given the realities we live with in the 21st Century. The following are the points of concern suggested at the meetings.

## Code of Sacred Honor Bill

1. All candidates will release prior to election day all information on their pensions, health benefits listing all monetary amounts and will make this information available to the public in a compiled single document.
2. The Code must be a formal Bill.
3. The Bill will demonstrate, in great detail, how federal elected and appointed officials will be held to a formal system of accountability and responsibility to their constituents; establish a process for citizens to review, monitor, and give their consent or not for the formal record.

For example – a system that includes - (1) electronic democracy (2) volunteer citizen review board (3) system to measure and verify information for each topic/issue (4) establish set of criteria and standards for budgetary position – how the positions will be selected and monitored

4. The Bill must include a mandatory account of personal history/finances and sources of all money for all election needs.
5. Candidate must be compelled to set forth a strategy to break the code of silence and secrecy in government.
6. Outline a comprehensive plan to trace and confiscate illegal drug monies that including returning the monies back to the communities of America to be spent as the communities see fit.
7. Candidate will set forth ways to be verified that he or she will utilize when faced with putting the people's interest before conflicts of interest to get elected.
